# <u>Conservation Technician</u> (Seasonal / Temporary)

Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District is seeking individuals to assist with water conservation programs and activities.

## **Job Summary:**

Administers water conservation programs by conducting landscape consultations and facilitating rebate applications. Duties include scheduling appointments, visiting homeowners, evaluating landscape designs and irrigation systems, entering data, and fulfilling general program requirements. Occasionally conducts tours and assists with the grooming and maintenance of Conservation Garden Park.

## Job Requirements:

Two years of college-level classes in horticulture or an equivalent degree preferred. Must have a general knowledge of horticulture, landscape irrigation, and



water efficient landscaping. Must also possess basic computer skills for word processing, spreadsheets, and web-based programs. Should be comfortable interacting with the public to promote awareness and interest in waterwise landscaping. Must be able to work outdoors.

Wage: \$13.00 per hour

**Hours:** Part-time and full-time positions (up to 40 hours/week) from March through October. Must be able to work a varied schedule including evenings, Saturdays and some holidays.
