Deer Creek State Park is nestled at the base of beautiful Mount Timpanogos 10 miles south of Heber City on Highway 189.

With 2,965 acres of water and predictable canyon winds, Deer Creek is a water sports haven. Deer Creek offers five species of sport fish including: rainbow and brown trout, large and smallmouth bass, walleye and yellow perch.

A full range of water-based activities are available at Deer Creek and fishing opportunities are exceptional. The park also offers campsites, picnic areas, trails and stunning views of the surrounding mountains and scenic Heber Valley.
