

Assistant Environmental Producer Job Opening

The Utah Rivers Council seeks an Assistant Producer with demonstrated experience to help our nonprofit produce a video series and we encourage film and environmental studies students at the University of Utah to apply.

Organizational Background

The Utah Rivers Council works to protect Utah's rivers and clean water sources for citizens and wildlife. The URC has had many successes in protecting Utah's rivers and promoting water conservation since 1994. More information on our work can be found by visiting www.utahrivers.org.

Job Duties

The Assistant Producer will assist the URC in planning and implementing a video series by helping to lead the logistics of individual shooting needs. This may include contacting interview subjects, scheduling interviews, organizing and managing logistics of production personnel, contemplating story content, helping to manage logistics at shooting locations, overseeing delivery of video transfer among contractors and other responsibilities. This is a part-time, temporary position over the summer months with weekly hours varying between 10 and 40 hours per week. The student will gain a glimpse at how film is used by nonprofits and advocacy groups to influence environmental policy.

Skills Needed

Excellent organization skills, comfort with multi-tasking and an interest in Utah water issues. Candidates must have experience in the TV/film production realm and be highly organized and capable of independent problem-solving. Compensation dependent upon experience.
